Section 14: Proceedings of the Governing Body

- The quorum is the number of governors needed in a meeting before decisions can be made via votes.
- If a meeting is not quorate (also known as being "inquorate") no votes can be held.
- An inquorate meeting can continue if governors prefer but they cannot make any decisions.
- The quorum for full board meetings is 50% of governors in post, rounded up to a whole number. Ignore vacancies. Ignore associate members.
